NATURAL TUNNEL

Siege at the Wilderness Road Blockhouse!
May 31 and June 1 - 10:00 am - 5:00 pm

Visitors will be able to walk through an 18th century encampment of Kentucky-bound settlers, watch as other travelers arrive on horseback, see various period crafts demonstrated, and visit a Woodland Indian camp. The highlights of the event include a horse race at 11 am Saturday, a battle at 1 pm when hostilities develop between the peaceful Indians, and frontiersmen who are underhanded in their dealings with the Natives, and a night battle at dusk on that day. Daniel Boone, who blazed that portion of the Wilderness Road to Kentucky beginning at the Blockhouse, in 1775, will assist Captain Anderson, and the other frontiersmen; while the Indians are led by Cherokee warrior Dragging Canoe. Sunday's high points will be a worship service at 11 am; and a frontier wedding at 1:00.
