Did you know?

Between Dec. 05 and Dec. 06, Go Green schools kept the following out of the nation's landfills:

- Nearly 3 million pounds of paper
- Over 223,000 pounds of cardboard
- 30,000 pounds of aluminum
- 58,000 pounds of plastic beverage containers
- 1971 cellular phones
- 10,906 printer cartridges
- More than 222,000 pounds of mixed recyclables
- 21,000 pounds of food waste

And comparatively speaking, that's just from a handful of the nation's schools involved in the Go Green Initiative.
